On the 2nd Sunday in February, which happens to also be Valentine's Day, the Legionnaires will perform a labor of love and serve breakfast. Once again, good food, good friends, good price.

On the 20th of December we had a very exciting Christmas Party for the children of the post, fun was had by all.


