Section 9 of the U.S. Flag Code states in part "During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag or when the flag is passing in a parade or review, all persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.

Citizens of other countries present should stand at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes." For more information on the U.S. Flag Code see http://

Corporate Board Update

A fine August welcome to all Post 177 members from your CB, this month's update comes as one of those too few and too far between updates. As most of you are aware it is the charge of CB to manage all the Post's assets, its leased properties, its owned properties, pay designated fixed expenses, maintenance & repair of the Post Home Building and its investment accounts.

You also need know that not many Legion Posts in the USA have a CB or the depth of inventory of investments and Property as just listed, we are very fortunate. So the point is our financial status of the Post is good. We just finished obtaining the approval of the CB Budget (over \$275,000) and the B&G Capital Improvement plans (Over \$101,000) for the Legion year 2016-17.

The CB budget this year for the third year in a row includes a line item for Post 177 Donations of \$52,000 (up from previous 2 yrs) and a deficit spending line item of \$60,000. These items are dollars in direct support of Post Operations that are no longer funded from the Post operations budget as sales in the social quarters, gaming and overall revenues are down and not covering expenses as they did in years past.

The CB has tasked itself to ensure we maintain a first rate Post and its offering to all our members. But the Post needs all its members to come out and support its functions and spend your dollars in support of the POST operations and provide ideas to management and the Executive Committee as to how to improve the Services of the Post operations and how to increase the usage of our wonderful facility.


This year the Legacy run started at Post 64 in Indianapolis, IN and ended at Post 199 in Harrison OH. The five day run went through Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, back up through Tennessee, and Kentucky before finishing up in Ohio. The ride stopped at American Legion Posts in every state and conducted nine wreath laying ceremonies with the National Commander.

Mike "Nick" Nicholas and Bruce Mersereau were Road Captain and Assistant Road Captain for Group "E", which consisted of Riders from all over Virginia. One of Post 177's newest members, Mike Baranick made the ride to Indy, and was able to make the first two days of the ride before having to head home on business. Brad Watkins and Devin Bright joined the ride in Dalton, GA and completed the Legacy run with the group.

Along the way the riders made donations to the National Commander for the Legacy Scholarship Fund, and each day the total continued to rise. The Post 177 Riders made a donation of \$13,731.00 and were presented a coin by the National Commander. This donation was raised during Run to the Thunder weekend, a fundraising event sponsored by Addictions Tattoo & Art Studio, along with generous donations from Staples Foundation, Post 177, and Rupaelia DDS. It was announced that as of 31 August the total amount donated to the American Legion Legacy Fund was \$1,155,363.

Although summer is all but over, the Riders will continue to ride with Dignity, Discipline and Respect to support and honor all of our Veterans, and pay respect to our fallen.

National Guard and Reserve Members VA Benefits:

Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Program supports and enhances the mobilization readiness of the Reserve components. The AGR includes both National Guard (Title 32) and Reserve members (Title 10) who serve full-time. National Guard members may establish eligibility for certain VA benefits by performing full-time duty under either Title 32 or Title 10.

Generally, all National Guard and Reserve members discharged or released under conditions that are not dishonorable are eligible for some VA benefits. Come to the seminar and find out what constitutes qualifying service for the National Guard and Reserve!

There will be a discussion of the most up to date information on VA home financing benefits. It will include information on options for disabled service members, Veterans and their spouses. Refreshments will be served so an RSVP would be appreciated but is not required
