And happy Veteran's Day! Post 177 will celebrate and observe Veteran's Day at the Post on Saturday, 12 November in the way that we usually do. After some remarks on the day we will conduct a Flag retirement ceremony where we will respectfully retire worn out flags that our community has brought to us for that purpose. Auxiliary 177 provides dinner on Saturday for East Tennessee when they come. This is one of the great programs that your entire Post family supports and I couldn't be prouder of all of you.

A few words on the subject of guests. Unlike some private clubs we do not limit the number of times an individual may visit as a member's guest. Many of us have friends who are not eligible to be a member of the American Legion or the Sons of the American Legion or the American Legion Auxiliary, but who are supportive of the Legion's ideals and programs and who we would like to have join us for a beverage and social time. It is hoped that guests who are eligible will want to join and that the member who brought them in will encourage them to do so.

Remember that you, the member, are responsible for the behavior of your guests. That means that you do not sign someone in that you do not expect to spend time with. Non-member guests may not buy alcohol or pull tab tickets, and may not play any of the gaming devices. Guests must leave when you leave. Members who do not comply with Post 177 guest policies are subject to losing their social quarters privileges.


