Happy New Year everyone! We made it through 2016 and it's now on to 2017. Got several things coming up in January and February.

8 January is the second Sunday of January and that means the Sons are serving breakfast! Always the best deal in town. This Sunday will be tinged with sadness though because we've lost Dave Shook, who transferred to Post Everlasting on 25 December. Dave was a great Son of the Legion and Legionnaire and served on the Son's executive committee and the Legion's executive committee and the corporate board. We will miss him greatly.

On 8 January, after breakfast, we will hold our Post 177 Oratorical Contest. Dusty Hamacher is running the program again this year and we are excited to hear what this year's high school student speakers will have to say about the U.S. Constitution. The contest will start at 1 pm on Sunday. All are invited to attend.

2 weeks later on 22 January the 17th District Oratorical Contest will take place. This will also be at Post 177, but this will be a contest between the winners of the various posts that had post level contests. The winner of the District advances to the Regional competition. The Oratorical Contest is one of the American Legion's signature youth programs helping to develop young Americans into good citizens with the confidence to speak publicly on matters of importance.

5 February is Four Chaplains Sunday. The annual 17th District commemoration of the heroism and selfless sacrifice of four US Army chaplains as their ship sunk in the North Atlantic Ocean will take place at Post 177 in the upstairs ballroom. On 3 February 1943, the USAT Dorchester, steaming in convoy taking US Army soldiers to England, was torpedoed by a German submarine and sank in the northern Atlantic. Among those being transported were 4 chaplains, 2 of Protestant faiths, 1 Roman Catholic, and 1 Jewish. The ship went down quickly. Most of the troops were young. The four chaplains on board comforted the troops and gave up their life jackets to save others. This is a very short synopsis of the story. Please come to the service on Sunday, 5 Feb, 10:30 and be part of this important service of remembrance.

12 February the Legionnaires will serve 2nd Sunday breakfast. Please join us for the best buffet in town.
