Commander's Corner

I am pleased to announce that the Office of Adjutant has been filled. Thank you and welcome to Tony Poulin. Tony is a retired Marine (I hear all you Devil Dogs out there going "oo rah" and barking). His wife, Donna, is active duty Navy and they both joined the Post on New Year's Eve.

In 2016 the National dues assessment was increased by \$5.00 from \$13.50 to \$18.50. Post 177 chose not to increase our dues at that time even though it effectively cut the income to Membership by about \$5,000.00. The Post keeps \$11.00 of the \$40.00 yearly dues paid by members. \$29.00 is sent to the Dept. of Virginia who keeps \$10.50 and sends the \$18.50 on to National. When you renew your membership and pay your dues online it just goes the other direction. National keeps \$18.50 and sends \$21.50 to Department who keeps \$10.50 and sends \$11.00 to Post 177.

Of the approximately \$11,000.00 in dues that Post 177 collected in 2017, \$8,072.00 was spent for printing and mailing this newsletter. That is 73% or about \$8.00 of each member's dues spent on the newsletter. Which leaves about \$3,000.00 each year to pay for the Early Bird Dinner, the Family Day Picnic, and the other miscellaneous membership expenses involved in running our post. We still have a surplus in the membership account that was accumulated before the last National dues increase but it is slowly decreasing.

The Executive Committee has is investigating options for newsletter production and dissemination. Constant Contact is a company that I'm sure many of you have heard of. You probably already receive newsletters and announcements from the other groups and organizations that you are involved with. For less than \$400.00 a year we can publish and send an unlimited number of email newsletters or special messages to our members.

While we believe that most people these days use email for communicating we are aware that there are some members who do not have an email address and we are considering ways to keep you in the loop also. We are not scrapping the printed newsletter yet and probably will not completely do away with it, but we need to make some changes and improvements. Watch for more information in our newsletters and on our website and Facebook page as we move forward.

American Legion Riders

The American Legion Riders of Post 177 have started the planning for the annual Run to the Thunder (RTT) event. This event takes place over Memorial Day weekend in conjunction with the Rolling Thunder Ride for Freedom Demonstration that has been held for 30 years to raise awareness and bring accountability for the Prisoners Of War-Missing In Action (POW/MIA) of all wars, "We Will Never Forget".

We are honored to be joined each by several Gold Star Families who have lost a son, daughter, husband or other loved one to war. For these families, every day is Memorial Day.

This will be our 7th year holding RTT where we host over 500 American Legion Riders Nation Wide here at our Post. For many riders, this is the main event of their year and we are honored to welcome them here at Post 177. Riders will start arriving on Friday and the weekend will kick off with a Friday night dinner for the riders held in the main Ballroom. There will a guest speaker, and the Honor Guard will conduct a POW/MIA ceremony.







On Saturday, there will be a ride to lay a wreath at the original Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Lee Mansion in Arlington National Cemetery. There will also be a bus to transport any non-riders that would like to attend the wreath laying ceremony. After the wreath laying, the Sons of the American Legion will be hold their annual BBQ at the post (1500-1800). The will be live entertainment provided from 1600-2000 by the classic Rock Band Riptide with our own Post 177 member, Dick Cole playing drums.







Sunday morning will kick off in the dark and early hour of 0430 when we start staging motorcycles in our parking lot. Breakfast will be served from 0500-0600. After a short ceremony, the group will move down to Patriot Harley Davidson to join the Ride of the Patriots. The Fairfax Harley Owners Group (HOG) runs the Ride of the Patriots each year and they give us a place of honor in the front of the formation of more than 4,000 motorcycles.

This is the largest event of the year for the Riders and the Post. It is also a great opportunity to host American Legion Members from all over the Country. We greatly appreciate all of the help from the Auxiliary, SAL and all of members and staff at Post 177.

The next CB meeting will be Tuesday, March 27th, 6:00pm at The Post.

The following information is again provided by the CB and the Building Initiatives Committee. We have reached NO decisions on the Building or remodeling for our future POST Home. All options are on the table and being formulated.

We, however, as you read below we have developed a strategy, to give you the latest in actions, some next steps and Points of Contact for you to provide feedback to or ask questions thereof.

Strategy

- In 1956 the American Legion sold a strip of land (now Panther Place) for \$5 to allow traffic access to then Fairfax High School.
- Paul the VI High School is moving and the land will become a private development 2019-2020.
- Panther Place as an access road into the development will significantly impact the American Legion, the LePort School, and our Little League field operations.
- Post 177 seeks the return of the land to preserve our ability to develop our land for the benefit of this Post and its mission

Latest events

- Presented a letter to the City of Fairfax stating our desire to have Panther Place returned to the Post. Awaiting reply
- Met with City Manager and delivered letters for City Council and Mayor.
- Attended City Planning meeting no actions affecting the Legion.
- Attended Joint session of City Planning Commission, City Council. The briefings are available on line: http://fairfax.granicus.com/GeneratedAgendaViewer.php?view_id=11&event_id=1468
- IDI developer, presented general plan for 550 Unit development. City Council general questions and planning commission. IDI is now in its next round of redesign. No indication of where they are specifically going:
- IDI presented a traffic study which shows significant overall increase on Oak street via Panther Way. Impacts to our post in our daily operations and weekend operations.

Next Steps

- Begin to schedule visits with the Fairfax City Council members
- We will in the not so far off future ask our membership to contact city council
- BIC committee has no recommendations for the membership on a refurbish, renovate or replacement of the Post building. We are 5 months into an 18-24-month process.
