
POST 177 LEGION NEWS

CORPORATE BOARD NOTES

-From Secretary Gary Welschenbach-

Spring greetings to all, hoping this finds each one of you, your families and friends continuing to be safe and healthy in this trying time, as we work on many things that must continue to sustain the American Legion and its mission.

1. The development project team for the New Post Home has submitted updated drawings to the City of Fairfax staff including all the updates of Key items of interest as defined in the last newsletter. In case you do not recall here are the key changes: reduce Affordable Dwelling Units by 7 apartments to increase parking, and allocate that 4 units within the building are to be part of the City Affordable Housing efforts. The Toll Brothers have modified their buildings from condos to what is called a TriPlex type of multi-family building with three units per "section". Chilcott Field will be limited to resurfacing the fields due to all the push back from the various staff agencies and City organizations. Overall green space remains above 22%. A Tot lot is proposed for placement near the ballfield. The reset addresses key issues of parking, traffic flow, entrances, and concerns that we were over building Chilcott Field. The new layout was presented to Planning Commission on 12 July, receiving positive response and the words of encouragement to proceed to City Council on 27 July. You are encouraged to write an email to each City Council member for their support on this project in quest of a new Post Home.

2. BUCKMAN Rd. Property – As you know, we now signed a lease agreement that will include an option to buy this property. To date all is going well on this effort.

3. The Corporate Board Has started back with in person meeting and a ZOOM alternative for its meetings. The very very tentative schedule for the next three months meetings is Wednesday 18 Aug, 15 Sept, 20 Oct. Meetings will begin at 7PM.

AMERICAN LEGION RIDERS NEWS

Well, it looks like we may be beating Covid finally. Things are opening up and the weather is now hot. Through it all your riders were still riding in a socially distant way.

In June five riders participated in the Virginia Legacy Run. We rode almost 800 miles around the Commonwealth of Virginia collecting donations for the American Legion Legacy Scholarship Fund. Our director created a new fundraiser for the ride by creating some targets for the ever-present bugs to hit. Unfortunately, a rain storm on the last leg of the ride washed the bugs off and a tie was declared with all proceeds going to the scholarship fund.



On the second morning of the ride one of the riders stepped up to present a \$50 donation from a local minister who had seen us at a fuel stop. Other riders started stepping up to match the donation out of their own pockets and in a few minutes \$2,100 had been raised. In total the riders collected over \$40,000 for the scholarship fund.

On July 3rd we had eight riders join the color guard and scouts in the Fairfax City Independence Day parade. We then returned to the post for a great lunch by the Son's. At 1300 we drew the winning ticket for our Spirits of America booze raffle. Jean Hendricks won the prize.

- The group-building activities were most effective at having the girls bond in our city and virtually getting to know one another.
 - Despite the challenging Virtual platform, I made lasting friendships
- Visits from the various government officials were very exciting and engaging and provided me with a lot of insight into how the government functions.
- My take-away from this experience is that:
 - the legislative process is a lot more collaborative than I initially thought
 - despite all of us holding varying political views, true leaders persevere towards what they believe will make the most positive impact, no matter their level of disagreement with others
 - while a career in elected office may not be what I am destined to do, I am eager to be involved in developing party platforms and advocating for social justice. In essence, I realized that while campaigning isn't for me, I am definitely interested in aspects of public policy like economics, global health, and equity.
 - the state of Virginia is so richly intertwined with different backgrounds! Living in the bubble that is Northern Virginia, Girls State allowed me to interact and hold conversations with people from differing perspectives and places - fostering a deep empathy.

Hats off to everyone involved for your continued dedication to the Girls State program and for all the hard work that went into making this 74th Session a huge success.
