The Adjutants Corner

This year the Department of Veterans Affairs announced that it has granted benefits to 1.1 million Veterans and their survivors, an all-time record. In total, the VA has awarded \$137B in Benefits, to Veterans and their Survivors this year.

To reach this milestone, The VA has processed more than 2 million claims in 2024, on pace to surpass last years record by more than 27%. The grant rate for these claims is 64.6% and the average overall disability rating granted to Veterans this year to date is 70%, equating to over \$20,000 per year in disability compensation for each Veteran.

I have learned that the best way to navigate this complicated, daunting process, filing for Veterans Benefits through the VBA is with selfeducation and awareness. For me, books on the process as well as You Tube is a fabulous source to learn about and participate in the Benefits process. While there are many Veteran Service Officers (VSO's) available to us, it generally is the Individual who fully understands and appreciates his or her own claim history that will develop and defend its merit. Once you understand the Claim process, you must then be prepared to wait months, and sometimes longer depending on the circumstances, and if you do not agree with the outcome, the wait time will continue, up to years if you take your appeal to the US Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims.

As Veterans, these are our Benefits and most will never utilize them. Educate yourself on all that is available to you and your family. Veterans Benefits, Veterans Healthcare and Veterans Discounts are there for us all so make the most of them.
